Spread of Covid-19 Coronavirus pandemic.	<p>CTC Staff, CTC contractors, skateboarders, and visitors to the skatepark.</p> <p>Vulnerable groups – elderly, pregnant women, those with existing underlying health conditions.</p> <p>Anyone else who physically comes in contact with other people in relation to your business</p>	<p><u>Hand Sanitisation</u></p> <p>Signage to be installed on skatepark boundary fencing for everyone using facility to be reminded on a regular basis use hand gel to sanitise their hands.</p> <p>Also reminded to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues or on the arm if a tissue is not available – Follow Catch it, Bin it, Kill it and to avoid touching face, eyes, nose or mouth with unclean hands.</p> <p>Tissues must be taken home.</p>		Medium	CTC by Mid-July 2020

Spread of Covid-19 Coronavirus Pandemic.		<p><u>Self-isolating or Covid-19 symptoms</u> Signage to be installed on the boundary fencing of the skatepark advising to not enter skatepark if they have symptoms.</p> <p><u>Covid-19 Spike</u> At the request of Central Government, Police or Local Government the tennis courts to be closed until restrictions lifted if there are reports of a Covid-19 spike in Clevedon. Or if a known case of Coronavirus requires the court closure for 72 hours to clean and cleanse the court.</p>		<p>High</p> <p>Outcome – Low to High depending on person</p>	CTC by Mid July 2020
		<p><u>Cleaning</u> Disinfectant for cleaning entrance gate must be provided by users of the skate park and reminded to clean the gate on entering and leaving the court. Notification will be via posters on display on the boundary fencing.</p>		Medium	CTC by Mid July 2020
Picnic bench on site		<p><u>Seating inside the skate park</u> The picnic bench that has been transplanted on the skatepark site will be removed by the CTC Caretaker.</p>		Low	CTC by Mid July 2020
		<p><u>Food and drink</u> Signage to be displayed on boundary fencing advising that food and drink is BANNED within the skatepark area and no provision for refuse will be available on the skatepark area.</p>		Low	CTC by Mid July 2020
		<p><u>Equipment</u> Signage to be installed on boundary fencing advising that skateboarders must not share items, including mobile devices and the cleaning of skateboards and other equipment used before and after use must also be done.</p>		Low	CTC by Mid July 2020

Spread of Covid-19 Coronavirus Pandemic		<u>Refuse</u> Signage to be installed on the boundary fencing advising that refuse must be taken home and not left on site.	<u>Refuse</u> The collection of refuse will be carried out on a regular basis by the CTC caretaker, as well as the CTC contractor on Sunday and Wednesday's.	Low	CTC by Mid July 2020
		<u>Behaviour on skate park</u> Signage to be installed on the skatepark boundary fencing asking users to abide by maximum number of 6 people.  Also advising that using the skatepark is to be entered into at the user's own risk and no liability will be accepted by CTC.  Only use an outdoor skatepark if you are actively skateboarding and leave immediately after finishing.  No congregating with other people in any circumstances on the skatepark.  Don't try difficult or dangerous tricks, save our NHS.		Low	CTC by Mid July 2020
		<u>Health, Safety &amp; Hygiene</u> Signage already in situ advising the public what to do if an accident occurs, i.e. emergency services to be informed as required and to confirm to CTC that first aid support was sought.		Low	CTC by Mid July 2020

Spread of Covid-19 Coronavirus Pandemic		<u>Pinch points – Gates</u> Signage to state the use of hand sanitiser before entering and after leaving the skatepark. Use of elbow to open gate.		High	CTC by Mid July 2020
		<u>Skate Park inspections</u> The CTC caretaker and CTC Councillors to conduct ongoing visual skatepark inspection of skate ramps, boundary fencing, signage etc, and provide written report of the time/date and any issues to be reported to the CTC office and acted upon accordingly.		Low	CTC by Mid July 2020
